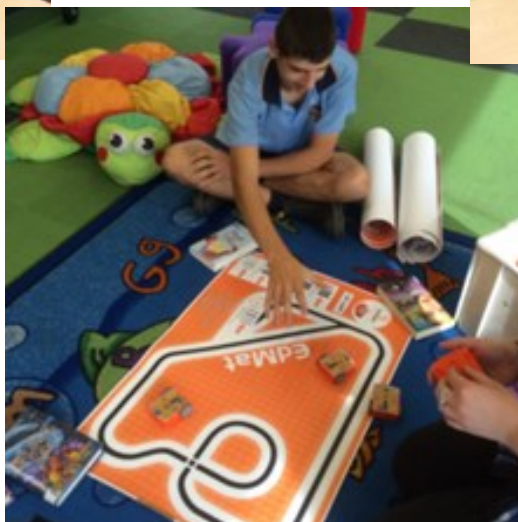

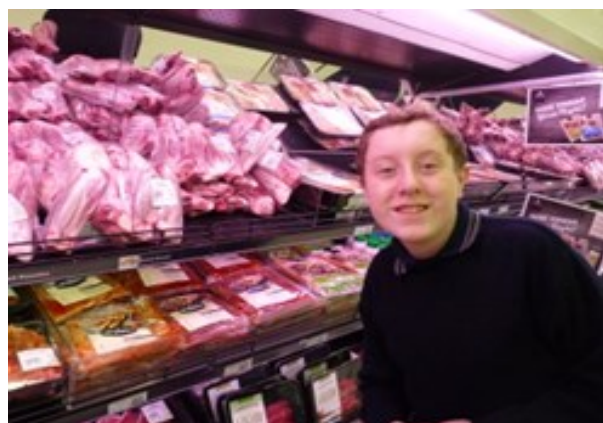


Using robotic cars and making kebabs were some of the activities students enjoyed.
